



## Guidelines – Photo Banners

1. Entry is open to everyone. Entrants aged under 18 years must seek parental/carer permission before submitting their images.
2. The entrant affirms that the submission (and any part thereof) is their own work and they own the copyright to their artwork.
3. Owners of selected images will be paid \$450.00 per image. On payment, ownership of the image passes to the Shire of Ravensthorpe and may be promoted on their websites and social media platforms, and any other promotional or advertising materials.
4. Submissions are limited to 6 images per person. Images must be submitted on USB in tiff file format to the highest resolution possible, and not downsized. An A4 image of each photo, printed on photographic paper as a minimum, is also to be submitted. Please note that the actual banner size is 700mmW x 2000mmH.
5. Submissions to be provided at the Shire of Ravensthorpe Administration Office, 65 Morgans Street, Ravensthorpe.
6. Latest time for submission of images is 4.00pm, 15 January 2022.
7. Entrants must provide the following with their images:
  - a. Their full name.
  - b. Email address.
  - c. Place of residence and postcode .
  - d. Description (max 100 words stating how the artwork relates to the region and where it was taken). This description may be used in promotional material by the Shire and credit the photographer.
8. Images will be judged by an independent panel and owners of the selected images will be notified by email.
9. The Shire reserves the right to remove any entry that is deemed offensive, derogatory or racist.
10. The Shire will collect, manage, use and disclose personal information in accordance with all relevant legislation and standards as per the *Privacy Act 1988 (Cth)*. The Shire will not sell any part of information collected or posted as part of the art competition and exhibition, nor will we disclose it to any outside organisation unless approved by you or as authorised under law. The Shire will take reasonable steps to securely store your information from loss, misuse and unauthorised access.
