Introduction

The *Freedom of Information Act 1992* (the FOI Act) is designed to:

- Enable the public to participate more effectively in governing the State.
- Make the people and bodies that are responsible for State Government and local government more accountable to the public.

In furthering these objectives, the FOI Act requires respondent agencies to publish an annual Information Statement. This guide to the Shire of Ravensthorpe (the Shire) serves as that statement and as a reference to the Shire's functions, responsibilities and information.

This guide details:

- Ways in which the public can participate in the Shire's decision-making processes;
- How the public can gain access to Shire documents.

The principal legislation governing the operation of Western Australian local governments is the *Local Government Act 1995*.
