

Local Government Act 1995 - Extract

s.5.60A - Financial Interest

A person has a financial interest in a matter if it is reasonable to expect that the matter will, if dealt with by the local government, or an employee or committee of the local government or member of the council of the local government, in a particular way, result in a financial gain, loss, benefit or detriment for the person.

s.5.60B – Proximity Interest

A person has a proximity interest in a matter if the matter concerns —

- (a) a proposed change to a planning scheme affecting land that adjoins the person's land; or
- (b) a proposed change to the zoning or use of land that adjoins the person's land; or
- (c) a proposed development (as defined in section 5.63(5)) of land that adjoins the person's land.

5.65 - Members' interests in matters to be discussed at meetings to be disclosed.

(1) A member who has an interest in any matter to be discussed at a council or committee meeting that will be attended by the member must disclose the nature of the interest:

- (a) in a written notice given to the CEO before the meeting; or (b) at the meeting immediately before the matter is discussed. (Penalties apply).
 (2) It is a defence to a prosecution under this section if the member proves that he or she did not know:
- (a) that he or she had an interest in the matter; or (b) that the matter in which he or she had an interest would be discussed at the meeting. (3) This section does not apply to a person who is a member of a committee referred to in section 5.9(2)(f).

5.70 - Employees to disclose interests relating to advice or reports.

(1) In this section: 'employee' includes a person who, under a contract for services with the local government, provides advice or a report on a matter.

(2) An employee who has an interest in any matter in respect of which the employee is providing advice or a report directly to the council or a committee must disclose the nature of the interest when giving the advice or report.

(3) An employee who discloses an interest under this section must if required to do so by the council or committee, as the case may be, disclose the extent of the interest. (Penalties apply).

5.71 - Employees to disclose interests relating to delegated functions.

If, under Division 4, an employee has been delegated a power or duty relating to a matter and the employee has an interest in the matter, the employee must not exercise the power or discharge the duty and:

(a) in the case of the CEO, must disclose to the mayor or president the nature of the interest as soon as practicable after becoming aware that he or she has the interest in the matter; and (b) in the case of any other employee, must disclose to the CEO the nature of the interest as soon as practicable after becoming aware that he or she has the interest in the matter. (Penalties apply)

5.71A. - CEOs to disclose interests relating to gifts in connection with advice or reports

(1) A CEO who has an interest relating to a gift in a matter in respect of which the CEO proposes to provide advice or a report, directly or indirectly, to the council or a committee must disclose the nature of the interest in a written notice given to the council.

(2) A CEO who makes a disclosure under subsection (1) must not provide the advice or report unless the CEO is allowed to do so under section 5.71B(2) or (6).

(3) A CEO who has an interest relating to a gift in a matter in respect of which another employee is providing advice or a report directly to the council or a committee must disclose the nature of the interest when the advice or report is provided.

Local Government (Administration) Regulations 1996 – Extract - In this clause and in accordance with Regulation 19AA "Interest" means an interest that could, or could reasonably be perceived to, adversely affect the impartiality of the person having the interest and includes an association.

The Shire President called for questions from Electors concerning matters under the jurisdiction of the Shire of Ravensthorpe.

Mr Ian Goldfinch

Question 1

Mr Goldfinch enquired about the progress of the Cultural Precinct.

Answer 1

Natalie Bell, Acting Executive Manager Development and Community Services reported that the project is on track with subcontractors working 7 days per week. Cost wise, the project is within contingency, with a couple of changes made due to design issues with the walkway.

A Stakeholder Engagement Meeting was held yesterday to discuss the use of the precinct and activating the areas.

An outstanding issue is the landscaping with work to be done on the final design, fencing and functionality of the courtyard within the building.

Question 2

Mr Goldfinch enquired about the plans for the external parkland and playground and if the public could contribute to ideas for the area; and, is the budget on track.

Answer 2

Ms Bell advised that Council is bound by the Grant Agreement, with certain milestones to be completed within a certain timeframe. The landscaping plan will be completely open for public consideration. The public toilet block has to be demolished, as part of the Grant requirements. The amphitheatre will not be built, however BBQs and shelters can be added. The stone walls and pond will remain.

Mr Matthew Bird confirmed that the contingency for construction of 10% or \$100,000 is within budget.

Question 3

Mr Goldfinch asked when the 2022/2023 Budget will be adopted.

Answer 3

Mr Matthew Bird advised that Council will workshop the Budget later this month.

Mr Goldfinch spoke about the Museum being a cultural place, where visitors spend hours, but it needs to be made more relevant as a tourist attraction to attract new younger members. Mr Goldfinch requested the Shire consider setting aside \$10,000 or obtain a grant to fund projects and expansion plans.

Mr Rodney Daw

Question 1

Mr Daw commented on the water carting from Hopetoun to Ravensthorpe, with constant road trains every day travelling to an open drain to deposit the water. Why doesn't the Water Corporation cover the dam, install a water tank, or consider tapping into the desalination plant at the mine?

Answer 1

Mr Matthew Bird advised that this is a Water Corporation issue, however the Shire will address this with them. The carting of water is at no cost to the Shire. We are currently in talks with FQM on a range of issues and we will address it with them.

Mrs Karen Sinclair

Ms Sinclair expressed her concern on the number of road trains carting water each day between Ravensthorpe and Hopetoun, being a safety issue.
