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**EXTRACT FROM LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1995**

**5.5. CONVENING COUNCIL MEETINGS**

- (1) The CEO is to convene an ordinary meeting by giving each council member at least 72 hours' notice of the date, time and place of the meeting and an agenda for the meeting.

## 5. ELECTION OF DEPUTY PRESIDENT

### EXTRACT FROM LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1995

#### *When the council elects the deputy mayor or deputy president*

- (1) *If the local government has an elector mayor or president the office of deputy mayor or deputy president is to be filled as the first matter dealt with —*
- (a) *at the first meeting of the council after an inaugural election or a section 4.13 or 4.14 election or after an ordinary elections day; and*
  - (b) *at the first meeting of the council after an extraordinary vacancy occurs in the office.*
- (2) *If the local government has a councillor mayor or president the office of deputy mayor or deputy president is to be filled —*
- (a) *as the next matter dealt with after the mayor or president is elected at the first meeting of the council after an inaugural election or a section 4.13 or 4.14 election or after an ordinary elections day; and*
  - (b) *subject to subclause (3), as the first matter dealt with at the first meeting of the council after an extraordinary vacancy occurs in the office.*

#### How the deputy mayor or deputy president is elected

- The council is to elect a councillor (other than the mayor or president) to fill the office.
- The election is to be conducted in accordance with the procedure prescribed by the mayor or president, or if he or she is not present, by the CEO.
- Nominations for the office are to be given to the person conducting the election in writing before the meeting or during the meeting before the close of nominations.
- Nominations close at the meeting at a time announced by the person conducting the election, which is to be a sufficient time after the announcement by that person that nominations are about to close to allow for any nominations made to be dealt with.
- If a councillor is nominated by another councillor the person conducting the election is not to accept the nomination unless the nominee has advised the person conducting the election, orally or in writing, that he or she is willing to be nominated for the office.
- The council members are to vote on the matter by secret ballot as if they were electors voting at an election.
- Subject to clause 9(1) the votes cast under subclause (5) are to be counted, and the successful candidate determined, in accordance with Schedule 4.1 as if those votes were votes cast at an election.

- As soon as is practicable after the result of the election is known, the person conducting the election is to declare and give notice of the result in accordance with regulations, if any.

#### **Votes may be cast a second time**

- If, when the votes cast under clause 8(5) are counted, there is an equality of votes between 2 or more candidates who are the only candidates in, or remaining in, the count, the count is to be discontinued and, not more than 7 days later, a special meeting of the council is to be held.
- Any nomination for the office may be withdrawn, and further nominations may be made, before or when the special meeting is held.
- When the special meeting is held the council members are to vote again on the matter by secret ballot as if they were voting at an election.
- The votes cast under subclause (3) are to be counted, and the successful candidate determined, under Schedule 4.1 as if those votes were votes cast at an election.

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**Summary:**

Councillor Kelton submitted her resignation from Council effective Friday 26<sup>th</sup> February and there is a need to hold an extraordinary election to fill the vacancy.

Council has in the past held elections as a postal vote election conducted by the WA Electoral Commission. An estimated cost of \$8500 including GST has been provided by the WA Electoral Commission.

**Background:**

Councillor Kelton's term of Office was due to expire in October 2017 and timing of her resignation does not allow for the vacancy to be held over to the 2017 elections.

**Comment:**

As more than 100 days has expired since the last election it is a requirement to call for enrolments to go onto the official electoral roll – this has the effect of delaying the date the election can be held.

Council can either conduct the election as a postal election with the WA Electoral Commission or run it as an in-person election themselves. As stated above the estimate for the WA Electoral Commission to run the election is \$8,500 – an in person election would cost in the order of an estimated \$3,000. The Chief Executive Officer can be appointed as Returning Officer for an in-person election but will not be appointed by the WA Electoral Commission to this role for a postal election.

The WA Electrol Commission has agreed to be responsible for the conduct of the extraordinary election provided it is held as a postal election.

With Council meeting on 14<sup>th</sup> March 2016 to discuss the conduct of the election it is proposed that the Election Day be set as Friday 3 June 2016 – setting it as a Friday reduces staff costs should an election be necessary. If there is only one nomination for the vacancy the result can be declared on Wednesday 27<sup>th</sup> April 2016.

If the Shire of Ravensthorpe wishes to have the election conducted as a postal election, council will now need to pass the following two motions by absolute majority:

1. Declare, in accordance with section 4.20(4) of the *Local Government Act 1995*, the Electrol Commissioner to be responsible for the conduct of the extraordinary election; and
2. Decide, in accordance with section 4.61(2) of the *Local Government Act 1995* that the method of conducting the extraordinary election will be as a postal election.

The current budget made a provision of \$15,000 for the conduct of the 2015 elections. \$9,560 of this was spent leaving a balance of \$5,440 – short fall of the estimated cost of \$8,500. The bulk of the shortfall can be met with the savings on members sitting fees and allowance whilst the position is vacant.
