
5.1 Galaxy Progress Report Dust monitoring results:

5.1.1 Dust monitoring:

New results for dust monitoring have been received for both the Dust Deposition Gauges (DDG's) and Hi Vol sampler.

DDG's- (measuring deposited dust):

June samples have been sent off to the lab for analysis and have not yet been returned. May Deposited dust results are below 4 grams/m²/month (ash Content), with a return assay of 0.80 grams/m²/month (ash Content) returned for DDG08 and 1.10 grams/m²/month for DDG09, see Figure 1. The control DDG (DDG20) has been included as a reference site, located 20km NE of the Mt Cattlin Mine Site in a farmer's paddock has returned the highest results at of 28.30 grams/m²/month.



5.1.2 Hi Vol Sampler- (measures respirable dust)

The below graphs show assay results for the Hi Vol sampler for PM10 and selected metals. The Hi-Vol is set up at a residential house on Kingsmill St within Ravensthorpe townsite.

PM10:

PM10 has remained below the threshold for the 24hr standard, see Figure 2.




Metals:


Metals tested for by the Hi Vol sampling program include Beryllium, Cadmium, Manganese, and Lithium.

All recent monitoring results show that both Beryllium and Cadmium remained below their trigger threshold of $0.000400 \ \mu g/m^2$ and $0.0006 \ \mu g/m^2$ respectively.

All monitoring results show that both Lithium and Manganese remain below the trigger threshold of 0.20 μ g/m² and 0.05 μ g/m², respectively.







6 COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT ACTIVITIES

6.1 Community issues Raised

Floater Road Diversion

GS – The final costing estimate of the road diversion (stage 2) construction was higher than expected. The road diversion (stage 2) will take longer to complete and will not be fully completed this year. To decrease the overall risk of the project, and also overall cost, a further design review and a geotechnical investigation is going to be carried out. The geotechnical investigation will be to the extent of the cut (excavation) within the area of the road diversion works envelope. This will determine the depth of any rock and minimise this risk. A review of the design is occurring to identify improvements to the construction, including the geometry of the road. It was identified that many local community members are concerned with the approach from the north which relate to the dip and curve in the road and the intersection crossings on the south entrance to Floater Road. The overall aim of stage 2 is to ensure ease of use for road trains using this route.

- KN- I am concerned that the old section that has been removed will not be reinstated as originally stated.
- GS- Old Floater Road will be reinstated for light vehicle access, at the completion of mining in this area.

24 hr Operation

KM- The 24hr operation was submitted to DWER and DMIRS, this proposal also included the development of the NW pit which will see the Mt Cattlin project extend 3 ½ to 4 years. Night shift is critical for the northwest pit development due to the high stripping ratio of waste to ore. DWER referred the assessment to DMIRS as they do not govern nightshift operations in the mining area but gave approval for the operation of the crusher over a 24hour period. Though this approval has been gained via DWER this is not necessary to be implemented as the current through-put capacity of the crusher is able to achieve the required tonnes for processing during the current working hours. Galaxy need to ensure compliance to the Noise Regulations and Standards. Increase



noise monitoring is occurring to ensure that compliance is maintained and were required mitigation strategies can be implemented.

Covid 19

KM- With covid-19 travel restriction inter-state some of the work force have remained in Ravensthorpe for over 120 days, away from there families. This is a great commitment which was being handled by the work force very well as an end date to this travel restriction was seen. With the recent change in events this end date is no longer seen which has placed greater stress on the work force. Some workers will be returning to their families in SA, job adverts have been placed and local workers will be considered to fill these positions.

Healthy lifestyle

In light of the recent events with Covid Galaxy have Launched a 12 week healthy lifestyle challenge to all within the local community, inclusive of Hopetoun residents. A special scale capable of determine percentage of body fat has been purchased by Galaxy, this will be used for this competition. Awards up for the taking by participants include;

- Gym Junkie award- the person with the most sign ins to either gym over this 12week period,
- Best body- The person who is deemed to have the best overall improvement before and after photos will be taken to determine this.
- \$1,000 Cash prize for the person who loses the most weight, considering fat percentage, with use of the newly purchased scales.

KN-One complaints were received on the 2nd July from a community member relating to blasting.

8 REHABILITATION AND CLOSURE

KM – showed overall map of Mt Cattlin to identify current area being rehabilitated.

PM – The selection of plants used for rehabilitation stem from the vegetation assessments undertaken at the start off and during Mt Cattlin operations. Further species where identified in consultation with the documents found in the Ravensthorpe Herbarium. Seed purchased was considered in relation to the province it was collected.

On the 24th July tub stock will be transplanted up to larger pots with P&C volunteers, Galaxy will provide a sausage sizzle for lunch to these volunteers.

On the 5th October RDHS and GXY will commence the planting of the tube stock on the portion of the WRL which has seen the preliminary site preparations carried out. This will continue over the following years until the hole face has been completed. This initial site will trial different methods to see which may work the best in the



future.
